### Severity of Animal-source Food Allergy across Europe: Data from the EUROPREVALL study

**(Prague, Czech Republic, 1-3 July 2022)** It is known that among animal-source foods, cow's milk, hen's egg, fish and shellfish are frequent causes of allergic reactions and anaphylaxis. However, there is a gap in the knowledge regarding the severity of such reactions and if there may be differences related to the kind of food involved and the geographical location in which they occurred.

Aiming to better understand the severity of animal-source food allergy across Europe, the recently published and thoroughly validated Food Allergy Severity Score (FASS) (Fernandez-Rivas et al. Allergy 2022) was applied to the data of reported immediate reactions to milk, egg, fish, crustaceans and meats collected by the 12 allergy-referral centres from the Europrevall outpatient clinic study, which to date remains the largest cross-sectional study of food allergy in Europe.

Milk, egg, fish and crustaceans were the foods of animal origin more frequently involved in allergic reactions in this analysis, with a higher proportion of severe reactions reported with crustaceans and fish, and an overall higher degree of severity in the Reykjavik and Manchester centres.

FASS seems to be a useful tool to adequately establish the differences in severity of animal-source food allergic reactions and therefore helps to provide a clearer picture of food allergy severity in Europe.
